

Malalai Joya speaks on **Afghanistan:**

Nearly Ten Years Into the US War

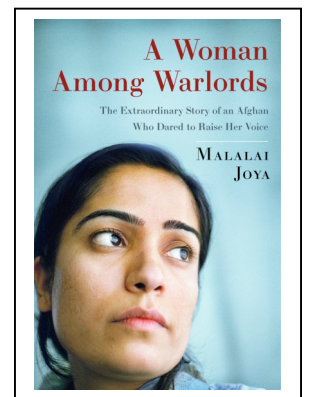


Malalai Joya, the world-renowned Afghan feminist parliamentarian, will return to the US for a book tour in March-April this year. The occasion is the release of the paperback version of her book, "Woman Among Warlords", with a new chapter on the Afghanistan war during Obama's presidency.

She will report from the ground in Afghanistan about where US tax dollars are really going and what our military is doing in her country.

Joya, now 33, was the youngest woman ever elected to the Afghan Parliament in 2005 and is an outspoken critic of the Karzai government and NATO occupation. She has written a memoir telling the story of her life in the context of three decades of war.

Joya details her reasons for opposing the US-NATO war and suggests concrete steps for building an independent and genuinely democratic Afghanistan.
